## The Benign Presence

A 32 bar strathspey for three couples in a longwise set.

This is for Rachel Wilton who has benignly presided over RSCDS London Branch for many years.

## Bars Description

1-4 1 st and 2 nd couples set advancing and take nearer hands facing up. Then 1 st couple cast off to 2 nd place as 2 nd couple dance up to 1 st place facing out. 3 rd couple turn to face up.

5-8 All dance half a mirror reel of three on the sides. 1 st couple start down and in. 3 rd and 2nd couples end with extra loops.

9-16 1 st couple turn giving right hands about three quarters to face their 1 st corner position. They then turn their 1 st corner left hand, partner right hand and 2nd corner left hand to end back to back on the diagonal, facing their 3 rd corner position.

17-24 1 st couple dance corner pass and turn with their 3 rd corners who turn each other with both hands in the centre. 1st couple pass right shoulder to repeat with their 4th corners and shorten their steps to end on their own sides with 1 st man just above 2 nd man (in 3 rd place) and 1 st woman just below 3 rd woman (in 1 st place).

25-32 All dance "accompanied rights and lefts". 1st man and 1st woman accompany 2 nd man and 3 rd woman respectively in alternate half right and half left hands across, progressing around each corner anticlockwise, while 3 rd man and 2 nd woman progress clockwise. 1 st man is either above or towards the women's side of his companion while 1 st woman is either below or towards the men's side of hers. Initially 1 st couple dance ahead of their companions.

- 25-26: 1st woman with 3 rd couple at the top, also 1 st man with 2 nd couple at the bottom, dance half right hands across. 1 st and 3 rd women end side by side in 1 st man's place facing down while 1 st and 2 nd men end side by side in 3 rd woman's place facing up. 1 st couple are on the outside.
- 27-28: 1 st and 3 rd women with 2 nd woman, also 1 st and 2 nd men with 3 rd man, dance half left hands across. 1 st and 3 rd women end side by side in 3 rd man's place while 1 st and 2 nd men end side by side in 1 st woman's place.
- 29-32: All repeat bars 25-28 from new places, 1st couple are now following their companions. On bars 31-32 1st couple shorten their steps to end in 2 nd place, briefly retaining hands with 3 rd man and 2 nd woman who make polite turns. All finish back on their own sides in the order 3,1,2.

## Notes

- I saw the figure of bars 25-32 being done spontaneously for fun by energetic young German dancers in a quicktime dance which officially ended with the standard rights and lefts for two couples. I thought it would be good to try it more sedately in a strathspey.
- At the time I was not consciously aware of the Wheelie Chain figure by John Drewry which appears in Drummond Castle (and others). The figure here is slightly different in that 1 st couple dance round anticlockwise and are ahead of their corner for the first four bars, whereas in the Wheelie Chain 1st couple dance round clockwise and always follow their corner.
